



Pastor's Desk

Healing the Sick

In the first reading and the gospel we see the focus on leprosy. Leprosy is not such a big deal today because of medicine. But, in Jesus' time, it was a big concern. Overtime leprosy can destroy the extremities of the body. This could cause one's face or body to be disfigured. If one had leprosy in Jesus' time, one would have to separate themselves from others. One would declare themselves unclean. Jesus wants to heal this man with leprosy. He wills it to happen. Jesus heals the man and Jesus tells the man not to proclaim the healing publicly. But the man did proclaim the healing publicly. This made it difficult for Jesus to move from one town to the next.

I often asked myself, "why would Jesus not want people to know about his healings?" I believe Jesus had a plan in place to bring the kingdom on earth. But he had to be very careful and intentional and precise when publicly healing and proclaiming his teaching. He knew that there would be ramifications from every action or word he would speak.

Breaking Free of Sin and Healing

What do you need to be healed of in your life? What is separating you from other people? I believe you need to ask the Lord for healing. I believe you need to have faith in Christ's ability to heal. Sometimes we can be too comfortable with our sin or sickness. We would not know how to act if we didn't have the sin or sickness in our life. So, we make that sin or sickness a part of ourselves. Some people are in prison and when they are released, they do not know how to deal with the freedom. So they go back to prison.

Jesus promises a new life but that comes with making better decisions and drawing closer to Him.

The reason Jesus heals is to draw people close to Him. What matters most is not the healing but the person's soul drawing close to Christ. Do you want to draw closer to Christ?







St. Joseph Church Pipe Organ Update



The Temporary Organ

There have been several developments regarding the pipe organ over the past few months. You likely noticed that the temporary digital organ in front of the church was removed in early December. What you may not have realized is that the organ currently being used at St. Joseph in the balcony is not our actual pipe organ, but another temporary digital instrument. This temporary organ was set up to create a sense of normalcy as we undertake the task of addressing the main pipe organ, which has sat silent since September.

The Pipe Organ Committee and Inspection

Under the direction of a Pipe Organ Committee, we had three pipe organ builders inspect our current instrument and submit bids to fix and refurbish the organ. After reviewing the inspection reports and bids, the committee was made aware that the current pipe organ cannot adequately provide what is demanded of it: the electrical control system has failed, structural issues were identified in the main chest of the organ, pipes were discovered to be collapsing and foreign materials were used to temporarily fix structural and tonal issues, and the overall voicing of the current organ was overpowering and shrill in tone.

The Recommendation

The Pipe Organ Committee unanimously recommended to the St. Joseph Parish Council and Finance Committee a full rebuild of the pipe organ to both honor the historical legacy of the pipe organ at St. Joseph Church and provide a quality instrument for future generations. This recommendation, along with the selected organ builder, were unanimously approved by members of both the Parish Council and Finance Committee. A signed contract was sent to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and is awaiting the Archbishop's signature.

The New Pipe Organ

The new pipe organ will address all the issues uncovered during the inspection and once completed, will be an incredibly artistic and musical instrument: both striking in sound and aesthetics. A rendering of the new pipe organ, along with its specifications, can be found on a display board at the entrance of the church.

- The new pipe organ console will have updated and computerized electrical systems.
- The internal structure will be rugged and utilize time-tested methods to ensure structural integrity and longevity.
- The organ will increase from 15 ranks of pipes to 40 ranks of pipes and will be voiced so that the organ can provide volumes ranging from a whisper to a full organ without overpowering the congregation.
- The façade and casework will blend harmoniously with the Italian Byzantine architecture of the church.



Notes from Emmanuel's Choir Loft

From Music Director Michelle Carner

Demystifying chant notation, part 2: Let's look at some of the marks surrounding the square notes. Sometimes there's a dot to the right of a note; this means to hold that note longer. Unlike in modern notation, it is not mathematically precise; the exact length is left to our musical judgment. Other times, there is a horizontal line above a note (or even a few notes); this, too, means to lengthen the note according to good musical judgment. (Vertical lines do not change a note's length.)


