The St. Gaspar Respect Life Group continues their focus on Euthanasia for the month of February.

Declared Brain Dead and Lived to Tell About It

In recent years there have been noted medical cases of patients who were declared brain dead but then recovered, such as Zack Dunlap and Trenton McKinley. Others have lived several years in a disabled state, such as Jahi McMath, who went through the changes of puberty after being declared dead. Doctors suspect the problem is they have no good test for neuro-endocrine function of the brain, so the entire brain wasn't really dead. Clearly, there is an ethical need for improved brain function testing in death determinations. Rather than calling for improving medical testing, the Uniform Law Commission, which suggests laws for states to adopt so they are consistent, is considering modifying the Uniform Determination of Death Act so that living people who are severely brain damaged can be declared dead. The National Catholic Bioethics Center offers a wealth of information on this and related topics. Go to ncbcenter.org and search for "Definition of Death". Be vigilant - the Culture of Death harms more than just the unborn. .

Pantry Helps Stretch Food Budgets



The largest and busiest component of our **Family Stabilization & Success Services** is our Dayton food pantry on West Riverview Avenue, open Monday through Friday mornings.

Love in Action

Those eligible to access our pantry can receive full service once every

30 days. Based on the size of the household, we provide enough food to last for about five days. Emergency food pantries like ours are designed to supplement the food people can purchase for themselves with their own income and other benefits like SNAP. We also make fresh produce available on a daily basis, with no restriction on how often clients can come back for these nutritious but perishable items.

Major construction now underway at our facility will provide a muchimproved pantry space, but it also means that we can't let clients "shop" the pantry and pick out items for themselves right now. Each day 8-10 volunteers are in the back, unloading the truck, stocking shelves, and packing food boxes. In the front, 2-3 volunteers help with intake and hand boxes to the clients. St. Joseph Church Pipe Organ Update

The Temporary Organ



There have been several developments regarding the pipe organ over the past few months. You likely noticed that the temporary digital organ in front of the church was removed in early December. What you may not have realized is that the organ currently being used at St. Joseph in the balcony is not our actual pipe organ, but another temporary digital instrument. This temporary organ was set up to create a sense of normalcy as we undertake the task of addressing the main pipe organ, which has sat silent since September.

The Pipe Organ Committee and Inspection

Under the direction of a Pipe Organ Committee, we had three pipe organ builders inspect our current instrument and submit bids to fix and refurbish the organ. After reviewing the inspection reports and bids, the committee was made aware that the current pipe organ cannot adequately provide what is demanded of it: the electrical control system has failed, structural issues were identified in the main chest of the organ, pipes were discovered to be collapsing and foreign materials were used to temporarily fix structural and tonal issues, and the overall voicing of the current organ was overpowering and shrill in tone.

The Recommendation

The Pipe Organ Committee unanimously recommended to the St. Joseph Parish Council and Finance Committee a full rebuild of the pipe organ to both honor the historical legacy of the pipe organ at St. Joseph Church and provide a quality instrument for future generations. This recommendation, along with the selected organ builder, were unanimously approved by members of both the Parish Council and Finance Committee. A signed contract was sent to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and is awaiting the Archbishop's signature.

The New Pipe Organ

The new pipe organ will address all the issues uncovered during the inspection and once completed, will be an incredibly artistic and musical instrument: both striking in sound and aesthetics. A rendering of the new pipe organ, along with its specifications, can be found on a display board at the entrance of the church.

- The new pipe organ console will have updated and computerized electrical systems.
- The internal structure will be rugged and utilize time-tested methods to ensure structural integrity and longevity.
- The organ will increase from 15 ranks of pipes to 40 ranks of pipes and will be voiced so that the organ can provide volumes ranging from a whisper to a full organ without overpowering the congregation.
- The façade and casework will blend harmoniously with the Italian Byzantine architecture of the church.

These include "Salve Regina" (Hail, Holy Queen) used in Ordinary Time between Easter and Advent; "Alma Redemptoris Mater" (Loving Mother of our Redeemer) from Advent to Candlemas; and "Regina Coeli" (Queen of Heaven, Rejoice!) at Eastertide. I am delighted to complete our repertoire of these traditional chants this week with the beautiful "Ave Regina Coelorum" from the 13th century: "Hail, O Queen of the heavens. Hail, O Lady of the angels. Hail, the root of Jesse, and the portal from which the world's true Light is risen. Rejoice, O glorious Virgin, O fairest of all creatures. Farewell, O most lovely one; pray for us to Christ, our Savior."
