



Our Service to One Another

In today's first reading, Job tells us that life can be somewhat of a drudgery. In the gospel we see Jesus healing.

"On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them."

You and I could see ourselves as hirelings and people who have no hope. But Jesus shows us in the gospel that he came to bring healing and opportunity for us to serve. When Jesus heals, he then wants us to go out and be his laborers in the vineyard. So this work that we do on earth is not necessarily

a drudgery. This work is meant to build the kingdom of God and give glory and honor to Christ and his church. We just need to focus differently. We also can't be people who indulge in pleasures all the time. That leads to addiction. Christians set themselves apart by showing the world that pleasures in this life are not the final goal. Now some of us may not cast out demons, but we can name the demons in our life and other people's lives. By naming them, we start the process of healing.

Our role as Christians is to build one another up and not tear each other down. This giving of oneself is what Jesus exemplified. A total emptying of oneself for Christ and others. Then we will have joy to the fullest.

We see that Peter had a mother-in-law. Peter was married. We do not know if Peter and his wife had children. But married life is a total emptying of oneself. The two sacraments of service in the church are married life and priesthood. We enter the sacraments by putting on an apron, knowing that our joy lies in our service to one another. Maybe that's why Peter became the head of the apostles. He knew what it was like to give up oneself for his wife, and maybe his children. As a married man, he may have understood what it meant to die to oneself.

Let us give ourselves away and not count the cost. We will be rewarded in the next life. We will not experience all the good and the bad this world has to offer.



From the St. Gaspar Respect Life Group

How are euthanasia and assisted suicide different? Is either one acceptable according to the Catholic Church?

Euthanasia is the ending of a life prematurely by medical means including depriving an individual of basic needs, i.e., food and water. A medical provider is actively ending the life. Assisted suicide entails making lethal means accessible to a patient at the time of his own choosing. While many advocate for these options as means of a dignified death, they ignore the fact that we do not have the right to kill or be killed.

The Catholic Church defines both acts as morally reprehensible.

Catechism of the Catholic Church – Euthanasia

2276 Those whose lives are diminished or weakened deserve special respect. Sick or handicapped persons should be helped to lead lives as normal as possible.

2277 Whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists in putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick, or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable. Thus, an act or omission, which of itself or by intention causes death in order to eliminate suffering, constitutes a murder gravely contrary to the dignity of the human person and to the respect due to the living God, his Creator. The error of judgment into which one can fall in good faith does not change the nature of this murderous act, which must always be forbidden and excluded.

2278 Discontinuing medical procedures that are burdensome, dangerous, extraordinary, or disproportionate to the expected outcome can be legitimate; it is the refusal of over-zealous treatment. Here one does not will to cause death; one's inability to impede it is merely accepted. The decisions should be made by the patient, if he is competent and able, or if not, by those legally entitled to act for the patient, whose reasonable will and legitimate interests must always be respected.

2279 Even if death is thought imminent, the ordinary care owed to a sick person cannot be legitimately interrupted. The use of painkillers to alleviate the sufferings of the dying, even at the risk of shortening their days, can be morally in conformity with human dignity if death is not willed as either an end or a means but only foreseen and tolerated as inevitable. Palliative care is a special form of disinterested charity. As such it should be encouraged.

Catechism of the Catholic Church - Suicide

2280 Everyone is responsible for his life before God, who has given it to him. It is God, who remains the sovereign Master of life. We are obliged to accept life gratefully and preserve it for his honor and the salvation of our souls. We are stewards, not owners, of the life God has entrusted to us. It is not ours to dispose of.

2281 Suicide contradicts the natural inclination of the human being to preserve and perpetuate his life. It is gravely contrary to the just love of self. It likewise offends love of neighbor because it unjustly breaks the ties of solidarity with family, nation, and other human societies to which we continue to have obligations. Suicide is contrary to love for the living God.

2282 If suicide is committed with the intention of setting an example, especially to the young, it also takes on the gravity of scandal. Voluntary co-operation in suicide is contrary to the moral law.



Demystifying chant notation: Have you ever wondered how to read those little square notes in the missalette for the entrance and Communion antiphons? You have probably noticed that the system is generally like modern music notation-there are lines and spaces which correspond to notes, and as they go up and down, we sing higher or lower. One important difference is that in chant notation, if you see two notes stacked directly on top of each other, as in syllables "in" or "ri" below, you sing the bottom one first and then the top one. (Sample is the second phrase of the "Ave Maria".) Stay tuned for more tips to come!

Critical Need for Blood

From Holy Trinity's Health Ministry

Solvate Blood Center (formerly Community Blood Center) is in critical need of multiple blood types because of recent high usage and low collections following the holiday period. Help meet this urgent need by donating and supporting the critical mission of January National and Ohio Blood Donor Awareness Month.

Type O blood is currently in low supply, and there is a critically scarce supply of type B blood. Type O is the universal blood type and in constant demand for emergency usage. Type B is rarer with fewer available donors.

A shooting and multi-vehicle collision on U.S. 35 in Dayton recently resulted in a spike in blood usage with 20 blood products transfused.


