# The Beginning of Lent

The sign of the Cross and ashes are two great symbols that mark the beginning of our Lenten season. The ashes symbolize the sinful nature of humanity, while the cross serves as a reminder of the need for a savior to redeem us. These two symbols call us to undergo metanoia, a process that requires us to ascend to the mountaintop to behold the glory of God. The tool for our conversion during this week is the virtue of listening. A change of heart stems from deep listening to God, to oneself, to others, and the events unfolding in our lives and in the world. God's voice resounds, saying, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." We are commanded to heed the words of Jesus Christ.

## **Be Sure to Listen**

Listening is paramount in our acts of worship. We cannot truly worship God, fast, or give alms to the needy unless we listen to Jesus's instructions. Sincere love for God necessitates attentive listening. Listening is fundamental to knowing God; we must listen to His word to understand Him. Faith is proclaimed, received, and practiced by those who listen. While faith may sometimes be proclaimed through words, it is often demonstrated through the examples set by Christians. Abraham serves as a testament today, as he not only listened attentively but also acted upon God's commands. Listening is an expression of love; those who love listen. Listening instills hope and facilitates dialogue, leading to peace in society. In today's world, cultivating a spirit of listening is crucial. However, it is challenging because of our preoccupations. Self-obsession prevents us from listening to others. We are creatures of action and time, often driven by our tasks and commitments. This obsession with action and time leaves little room for listening. We prioritize efficiency and speed, viewing listening as a waste of time. Let this Lenten season leave a lasting impact on our hearts, teaching us that the time spent listening and engaging in dialogue with others is more valuable than gold and silver. God calls us to listen to Jesus, as listening demonstrates love, deepens faith, and fosters peace. In today's world, there is a greater need for listeners than for those who speak.

# Kill the Brain but Keep Organs Alive for Harvesting

There are major ethical violations associated with a new medical technique called Normothermic Regional Perfusion, developed in Europe, and now in use in the United States. This intervention keeps oxygenated blood flowing to the organs of donors, with the notable exception of the brain, in order to optimize their quality for transplantation. The donor's heart stops beating, and the medical team waits a certain number of minutes. The person is then declared dead by cardiac criteria and Normothermic Regional Perfusion follows. Almost unbelievably, the transplant team clamps off the major blood vessels to the brain and arms to ensure the person's brain will die due to lack of oxygenated blood. Then circulation of oxygenated blood is restarted using a heart lung bypass machine. The rationale is that donors do not revive after declaration of cardiac death because they are on bypass technology and now fulfill the criteria for brain death. ## ABSTINENCE



Abstinence pertains to the act of avoidance of something. For us Catholics, we abstain from eating meat during Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. People with ages 14 and above are required to observe abstinence.



Lamb, chicken, beef, pork, ham, etc., are not allowed. Eggs, milk, and fish are allowed to be eaten during days of abstinence including grains, fruits, and vegetables.



Fasting pertains to the act of doing with less of something. Those who are 18-59 years old are required to fast during Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. They must eat one full meal and two small meals that if combined will not be equal to a full meal.



During fasting days, it is forbidden for Catholics to eat snacks in-between meals. Of course, those with medical conditions might be excused.

Despite all this, the enthusiasm to finish the church is high. The cost of roofing the church has been estimated at \$51,179. After the roofing we will begin the plastering, painting, windows, plumbing, electricity, flooring, the altar and the sanctuary, the ceiling, providing the statues, and many others. It is on this note that your continuous financial support to KumboKids and Community is of paramount importance. Thank you immensely for your readiness to continue to support these projects, and may God abundantly bless you.


