



Next Generation Parish is a four-year experience that will provide our pastor and our community with the opportunity to assess the parish's greatest opportunities and strengths, develop a plan to move into the future with hope and cultivate a deeper missionary spirit throughout the community.

Phase 1: Prepare (4-6 months)

Comprehensively assess the parish health, culture and effectiveness.

Phase 2: Envision and Plan (6-9 months)

Create a parish plan with priorities and goals. Train and support priests, staff and parishioners in leadership and evangelization.

Empower parishes to sustain and expand their pool of leaders.

Phase 4: Assess, Learn and Grow (6-9 months)

Measure impact, refine plans and celebrate successes.
