

Beacons of Light - Over the course of the past year, Fr. Tony Fortman and Fr. Angelo Anthony have been working together to prepare our parishes to become a Family of parishes. The current name of our Family of parishes is “NE6” or the North-East Six parishes in the Dayton Deanery. One of the instructions we have been given in the Beacons of Light process is to develop a popular title for our Family of parishes. In reflecting upon this task, we discerned that one commonality among our parishes is that we are served by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, founded by St. Gaspar del Bufalo in the year 1815 in Giano, Italy.

During the recent combined meeting of our six parish councils, we offered several titles for our Family of parishes that reflected some aspect of the life of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. These included, St. Gaspar, Our Lady of the Precious Blood, Blood of Christ, St. Francis Xavier (Patron of the CPPS), and St. John XXIII who had a great devotion to the Precious Blood. An overwhelming majority of the members of our parish councils chose “St. Gaspar” as an appropriate name for our Family of parishes.

Given this support Fr. Tony and Fr. Angelo would like start using the name “St. Gaspar Family of Parishes” as the popular title for our North-East Six, NE6 Family of parishes. This title has been approved by the Chancellor’s office and our plan is to begin using the title on July 1, 2023 when Fr. Tony becomes pastor of our Family of parishes. On July 1st we will launch our combined parish bulletin and our combined Family of parishes website to help facilitate communication within our new St. Gaspar Family of Parishes.

FR. ANGELO’S REFLECTION

Back in the 4th Century, St. Augustine proclaimed: “We are Easter people and alleluia is our song!” The word Alleluia comes from the Hebrew phrase meaning “Praise the Lord!” We give praise to God because Christ is Risen from the dead. We stand in wonder and awe of this great mystery of our faith. Have you ever noticed that the word Alleluia begins and ends with an open vowel “ah?” We can’t sing “Alleluia” with our mouths closed. The word “Alleluia” speaks to our mission to proclaim the good news that Christ is risen.

By keeping Christ’s commandments of love and service, we testify how glad we are to be part of Jesus’ life. We are an Easter people with whom and in whom the Lord lives! Next week we will celebrate the Lord’s Ascension into heaven. In our gospel reading today, Jesus is preparing his disciples for the time when he will no longer be with them in his earthly body. He reassures them that he will always be with them by sending another Advocate, the Spirit of truth, to be with them and us forever.

Because of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus we know that sin and death do not have the last word. A different script has been written and now all things are possible with God. Would other people be able to tell that we are an Easter people? Do we live in the hope rooted in God’s covenant of love sealed in the Blood of Jesus?

The virtue of Hope teaches us that God is working all things to the good no matter how dark or confusing life may be. Hope is not dependent on other people’s actions or choices. It is a gift from God that enables us to be at peace even in the challenges of life because we believe that God is ultimately in control.

As Christians, we cannot keep the life we share in Christ all to ourselves. Our thoughts, words and actions must reflect and express the life of Jesus. His life has become our life, our hope of glory. By cultivating hope, we can keep our hearts open to the action of God in our lives. Hope is nurtured by living as a child of God, by seeking God in the most common experiences of life. Spending time in relationships that form community, by encountering beauty, or seeing the cross as a gift to be embraced are all ways to live in hope.

In this month of May Pope Francis reminds us, “We have a Mother, Mary. Cling to her as children cling to their mother, living in the hope that rests on Jesus. When Jesus ascended to heaven, he brought to the Heavenly Father our humanity, which he assumed in the womb of the Virgin Mary. Like an anchor, let us fix our hope on Christ. May this hope guide our lives, until our dying breath.” Our primary vocation as Christians is to be people of hope in the world. Jesus says to us, “Because I live, you will live.” This is the cause of our joy!
